

<p>Moving Stand</p> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> • The team heels to the exercise sign. Handler cues dog to remain standing. The dog may not sit first. The handler may give a verbal and hand signal simultaneously but may not touch the dog. • The handler leaves the dog <p>(must be followed by <i>Call to Heel</i> or <i>Down, Sit, Call Front and Finish</i>)</p>	<p>Moving Stand – Walk Around</p> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> • The team heels to the exercise sign. Handler cues dog to remain standing. The dog may not sit first. The handler may give a verbal and hand signal simultaneously but may not touch the dog. • The handler walks around the dog and returns to heel position. • The team then heels forward to the next exercise sign.
<p>Down, Sit, Call Front and Finish</p> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> • The handler leaves dog and walks to the Down, Sit, Call Front & Finish sign and turns and faces the dog, approximately 6 – 10 feet away. • The handler then cues the dog to Down, then Sit, then Come to Front. The handler may cue the dog to finish either Right or Left. • The handler may use verbal and hand cues simultaneously • Once the dog is in heel position, the team heels to the next exercise sign 	<p>Call To Heel</p> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> • The handler leaves the dog and walks to the Call To Heel exercise sign, approximately 6 - 10 feet away. • The handler turns and faces dog, then calls dog to come to heel position without coming to front first. • Once the dog is in heel position (the dog does not have to sit at heel) the team heels to the next exercise sign.
<p>Moving Backup</p> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> • While heeling, handler cues dog to backup from a standing position. • Handler takes three steps back. • Dog must walk backwards with handler in heel position. • Dog must not sit before backing up and handler must not halt before backing up • Team then heels forward without stopping to the next exercise sign 	<p>Halt, Recall Over Jump, Leave Dog</p> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> • Team halts at a spot approximately 20 feet away from jump and 8 feet to either the right or left of jump, depending on course layout. • Handler leaves dog in a Sit and walks to a spot approximately 20 feet to the other side of the jump and directly facing the dog.
<p>Turn, Call Over Jump, Finish or Forward</p> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> • Handler faces dog and calls dog to come. • Dog must come over jump and sit in front of handler. • Handler then cues dog to finish or forward either Right or Left. • Team then heels to the next exercise station. 	<p>Halt, Send Over Jump</p> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> • Team halts at a spot approximately 20 feet away from jump and 8 feet to either the right or left of jump, depending on course layout. • Handler leaves dog in a Sit and walks to a spot approximately 20 feet to the other side of the jump and directly facing the dog.
<p>Right Turn – Down – Forward</p> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> • Handler turns to right, taking one or two steps and cues dog to move with her. • After turning and while moving, handler cues dog to Down. • Dog may not sit before the Down. 	<p>Turn and Send Over Jump, Finish or Forward</p> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> • Handler then cues dog to take the jump. Handler may use hand and verbal cue simultaneously. • Dog must take the jump and come to front position. • Handler turns slightly so that the dog can come to front position after taking the jump but does not move forward towards the dog. • Handler then cues the dog to either Finish or Forward to Right or Left. • Team heels to the next exercise sign.

<p>Serpentine</p> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> • This exercise uses four cones, approximately six feet apart in a straight line. • Team enters with the first cone on their left. • Team weaves through the cones and exits at the last cone. • Team does NOT weave back down through the cones. 	<p>Left Turn – Down – Forward .</p> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> • Handler turns to left, taking one or two steps and cues dog to move with her. • After turning and while moving, handler cues dog to Down. • Dog may not sit before the Down.
<p>Turn, Recall, Down, Recall, Finish or Forward</p> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> • Handler turns and faces dog. • Handler calls dog to come. • At any point while dog is coming, handler cues dog to Down. • Once dog is Down, handler calls dog to come again. • Dog comes to front position and handler cues dog to finish or forward either Right or Left. 	<p>Halt - Down on Recall – Leave Dog</p> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> • Team halts at exercise sign. Handler cues dog to Stay/Wait and walks approximately 15 feet away to next exercise sign.
	<p>Turn - Halt - Retrieve</p> <p>1. Before entering the ring, the handler will give the ring steward a retrieve object of choice (toy, ball, dumbbell, glove, bumper, etc) / 2. As the team is heeling to this exercise sign, the ring steward will unobtrusively place the retrieve object on the floor approximately 15 feet from the exercise sign. / 3. This shall be done while the team's back is to the steward so the dog cannot see the object being placed. / 4. At Turn – Halt exercise sign the team shall perform either an About U Turn or About Turn Right and Halt. / 5. Handler will direct the dog to look at the retrieve object. / 6. Handler then sends dog to pick up object and return to front position. / 7. Handler takes object from dog and finishes dog Left/Right.</p>
